# **2026** Budget Process Begins with BOS Discussion and CIP Meeting

With a preliminary budget discussion at the Selectmen's meeting on September 8, and the first meeting of the Capital Improvement Program Committee (CIP) on September 10, the lengthy process of developing the 2026 town budget and warrant is underway. It is a process that will involve all of the town's boards, committees, and department heads, and will culminate in presentations at the town deliberative session in February followed by voting on the warrant in March 2026.

At the September 8 meeting Selectman Jack Dearborn presented the board with a ten-year operating budget comparison spanning 2015 – 2024. He credited Finance Administrator Beth Rouse for working with him to prepare the report. The analysis included the Social Security cost of living increase each year as well as the actual percentage increase in the operating budget for those years. It noted that out of the last ten years, there were four approved budgets and six default budgets. The report also listed examples in four general budget categories: contracts, payroll, non-discretionary items, and discretionary items. Additional details are available in the minutes of the September 8 meeting posted on the town website.

At the CIP meeting on September 10, Denise Purington was elected to chair the committee and Tom Clow was chosen as vice chair. Other members of the committee include Gary Shelto, BOS representative Jack Dearborn, and Planning Board representative Craig Francisco. The committee heard requests from the three major departments: Police, Fire Rescue, and Public Works. The

Police Department is requesting a 2026 Chevrolet Tahoe, as a frontline vehicle to replace a 2018 Dodge Charger, and the construction of a five-bay carport with one bay enclosed for the storage of evidence.

For 2026 the Fire Rescue Department is requesting a 30,000-gallon water cistern to be placed at the Safety Complex and two portable ventilators. In addition, Fire Rescue presented a preview of its requests for 2027- 2035.

The Department of Public Works is requesting a ten-wheel plow truck to replace an outdated truck and funding for the annual road reconstruction program. It is also requesting a scale for weighing demolition and construction debris at the transfer station.

The CIP Committee is scheduled to meet again on September 24 to hear requests from Parks and Recreation and the Library. On October 1, the committee will meet to consolidate all requests into a report to the Planning Board, the Board of Selectmen, and the Finance Committee.

The final decision on what goes on the town warrant, and in what form, rests with the Board of Selectmen.


