Town Administrator Bolton to Retire on November 30

At the September 22 meeting of the Weare Board of Selectmen, Town Administrator Naomi Bolton announced her retirement effective November 30, 2025, ending more than 30 years of public service to the town. In an interview, Bolton said that her first job with the town was as part-time secretary for zoning and planning in February 1995. She took a full-time position as secretary in the highway department in November of that year and has served in multiple positions since that time, including 16 years as Town Administrator.

Something that Bolton takes obvious pride in is her emphasis on cross-training of staff over her years as town administrator. With members of the staff able to do multiple jobs, it allows the town office to be open longer hours without resulting in large overtime expenses, she said.

Bolton's retirement follows her receiving two distinguished honors. The New England Chapter of the American Society for Public Administrators (NEASPA) presented her with the Robert H. McClain, Jr. Distinguished Public Administration Award "in recognition of her outstanding leadership and enduring commitment to public service." "Most notably," it continued, "Naomi was instrumental in the creation and establishment of the New Hampshire Women in Leadership Institute."

Bolton also received the James W. Tethers Award from the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission (SNHPC). In the commission's October 25 *Media Blast* newsletter, SNHPC Executive Director Sylvia von Aulock enumerated Bolton's involvement in many regional initiatives and added, "Beyond her technical expertise, Naomi's genuine love for her community and her steady leadership has made her a cornerstone of local and regional planning." Bolton has served on the SNHPC Executive Committee since 2020.

Bolton's contributions to the community have reached beyond the doors of the town office building. In 2001 she was instrumental in getting the funds started to construct the Francis Arthur Bolton, Sr. Memorial Park consisting of a baseball field, a soccer field, and a football field. She and a few other parents started the John Stark Generals Youth Football Association in hope of bringing football to Weare, she said. The program expanded, and now there is a football program at the high school as well. Bolton said she also coached her two sons in basketball and baseball and was a WAC board member. She also established the current food pantry in the basement of the town office building as a non-profit 501(c)3. The food pantry recently received a donation of \$20,000, she said.

Bolton said that she and her husband Bill built the house they live in in 1983 and were married in 1984. They have two sons, Jason and Jeremy, daughters-in-law Sarah and Heather, and three granddaughters, Caroline, Lydia, and Charlie. They also have a grandson on the way. She said that she and Bill plan on traveling, which will include snowmobiling (which they both love) and enjoying their kids and grandkids for many years to come.

Flaherty and Kallipolites to Lead Finance Committee

The Weare Finance Committee held its first meeting for 2026 budget review on September 24. At this organizational meeting Tom Flaherty was elected chairman, Jessica Kallipolites vice-chair, and Kate Blume secretary. Town Moderator Daniel Wandell had sworn in Blume as a new committee member at the start of the meeting. Wandell also read aloud the town's social media policy and code of ethics and had all members sign acknowledgement forms for each.

An ordinance creating the Weare Finance Committee was first approved by voters in 1929 but has been amended many times since then. The latest amendment was approved by voters in March of 2012. The ordinance calls for a committee of at least nine, but not more than thirteen members. The group is charged with reviewing all warrant articles, including operating budgets, for the Town of Weare, Weare School District, and John Stark Regional School District and making recommendations to voters.

The committee is divided into subcommittees who attend budget meetings of the town and the two school districts and report back to the committee as a whole. The subcommittees for the 2026 budgets were organized as follows: Town of Weare; Jessica Kallipolites, Kerry Urie, Maria Fossiano, and Lori Davis; Weare School District: Neal Kurk, Kate Blume, Elizabeth Evans, Bill Anderson, and Lori Davis; John Stark: Tom Flaherty, Kyle Bozoian, and John Merva

In the weeks ahead the committee will hear presentations by the CIP, a subcommittee of the planning board, all town department heads, and school officials from Weare and John Stark. The finance committee's recommendations are printed in a mailer that goes out to all households in town and are also presented at the town and school deliberative sessions in February.




